What new opioid prescribing best practices, if any, has your state adopted to address the opioid epidemic?

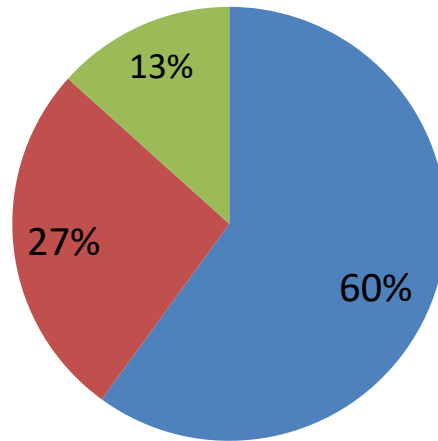


Does your state have a functioning Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (PDMP)?



Does your state require you to use the PDMP program?

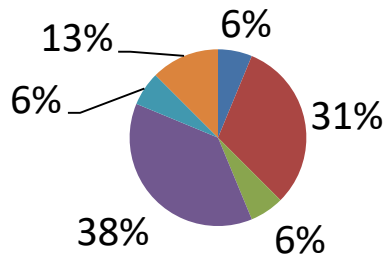
