- I. Geraldine T. O'Shea, DO, called the meeting to order at 4:02 PM. Dr. O'Shea presented the agenda for approval. Joseph Zammuto, DO, made a motion to approve the agenda; seconded by Scott Steingard, DO. The agenda was adopted unanimously.
- II. Dr. O'Shea presented the January 10, 2015 meeting minutes and asked if any amendments would be offered. There were none. Dr. Zammuto made a motion to approve the minutes; seconded by Anita Steinbergh, DO. The minutes were adopted unanimously.

III. Dr. O'Shea asked Nick Schilligo to provide background information and updates on the recent US Supreme Court finding on North Carolina State Board of Dental Examiners v. Federal Trade Commission. Mr. Schilligo provided a summary of the issue and overview of the Court's finding that the Board lacked sufficient supervision by the State of North Carolina to allow for antitrust immunity. Although the Board offered limited guidance on expectations for what would be expected to meet "active supervision" requirements for state licensing boards engaging in scope of practice issues.

Dr. O'Shea suggested that this ruling may have wider implications. She asked if this has been discussed by the state boards and how this might impact scope of practice activities for state medical examining boards. Several individuals provided insights on recent activity and discussions by their boards as a result of this outcome.

IV. Dr. O'Shea discussed the necessary changes required to state licensing laws and regulations as a result of the new Single Accreditation System.

- a. Dr. O'Shea provided an update on a resolution that the AAOE provided feedback on for the AOA Annual Midyear Meeting. A decision was deferred on this resolution by the AOA Board of Trustees; the issue will be on the Board of Trustees agenda for the 2015 AOA Annual Meeting.
- b. Mr. Schilligo provided analysis of each states post graduate education statute and rules, and mentioned his recent comments on this resolution at the Council on Postdoctoral Training meeting.

V. Organizational Comments

- a. American Osteopathic Association (AOA)
  - i. Barbara Walker, DO, AOA Board of Trustee, provided an update on the AOA's strategic plan.
  - ii. Dr. Walker provided a report on the continued collaboration with the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) and the progress of a unified graduate medical education system.
  - iii. She also informed the fellows of the ongoing activities related to Maintenance of Licensure (MOL).
- b. National Board of Osteopathic Medical Examiners (NBOME)
  - i. Dr. O'Shea invited guests from the NBOME to provide an update on their recent activities and collaborations. Janice Knebl, DO and Sandra Waters, MEM discussed the NBOME's COMLEX-USA program and changes to notations on exam reports.
- c. Federation of State Medical Boards
  - i. Donald Polk, DO, Chair, Federation of State Medical Boards (FSMB), gave an update of FSMB activities.

VI. Dr. O'Shea started the discussion of AAOE officer elections, and presented the nominees for each office. ## Chair's Report: *A Tribute from Jane Carreiro*

Dear Colleagues,

Over the past months, the OIA Board has been busy on several fronts and I would like to take this opportunity to share some highlights with you.

On May 19, 2015, the OIA Executive Secretary Josh Kerr, Immediate Past-Chair Michael Mulholland-Licht and I were invited to meet with Zhang Qi, Coordinator of Traditional and Complementary Medicine (TCM) Division at the World Health Organization (WHO). Dr. Zhang discussed two projects

the WHO plans to develop. The first, a **Global Report on Manual Therapies**, will include all internationally used modalities. Experts within the TCM division will draft the document using collected data and information. Work was scheduled to begin on the report in the later part of 2015 and Dr. Zhang solicited immediate input from the OIA on the outline of the report and the content of the questionnaire. With Mr. Kerr's assistance, Mr. Mulholland-Licht and I shared these drafts with the Board and were able to provide input to the WHO before the end of May. (Bravo to the Board for their timely response!)

A second planned WHO-TCM project is a report on the safety and quality of service delivery in traditional and complementary medicine. This is needed to promote safe practice standards. The WHO plans to select institutions in several countries to identify challenges to quality and safety assurance and describe successful responses. These will then be compiled into a checklist that can be adapted and shared between countries and modalities. Mr. Mulholland-Licht and I identified many similarities and parallels between this planned WHO project and the timelines. The proposal will then go before the appropriate WHO committee, WHO board and OIA board for review. The collaboration must show mutual benefit to both groups. In the meantime, we have agreed to move forward with the Global Report on Manual Therapy, which will be a comparison of capabilities among professions (the OIA can also ask for contacts for this, to help lead it and to provide information for Stage 2 of our Capabilities document). This global report and our Stage 2 of the Competency Domains document will show collaborative work with other professions, and along with our previous projects together, should move forward official relations.

The OIA has granted Elsevier and the International Journal of Osteopathic Medicine the right to acknowledge that the journal is recognized by the OIA. It is not the official journal. The OIA board is interested in collaborating with other journals that are of importance to the profession.



Sadly, the OIA board accepted the resignation of our dear friend and colleague Josh Kerr in July. Josh has taken a wonderful position with another medical organization in the US and he will do a fantastic job, but we will miss him. Linda Mascheri and Verna Bronersky have stepped up to assist the OIA until a new executive secretary is identified. The OIA contracts with the AOA (US) to provide staff assistance. The OIA board and I are working closely with the AOA (US) to identify the OIA needs as we grow and progress in our mission.

I would like to thank everyone who has contributed to the mission and goals of the OIA. For a many years the global osteopathic profession has been trying to steer the focus of health care towards “patient health”. With the emerging focus of the WHO, it appears that health care may finally be moving in that direction. As we move forward, we need to remember that we have not been alone in this endeavor. Other professions have been working towards this end as well. Just as the streams of the osteopathic profession have had to disassemble barriers and assumptions to come to a recognition of that which the streams hold in common and that which make them distinct, we need to be leaders in breaking down the barriers that exist between similarly minded professions. We need to educate, support, and role model inclusion and inter-professional collaboration for the benefit of our patients.

## ***Highlights from the Annual General Meeting***

### **Board Elections**

Mr Antony Nicholas, CEO of Osteopathy Australia was elected as Member-at-Large to the OIA Board for a three-year term, replacing Mr Michael Mulholland-Licht who completed his second term. Dr William Burke was elected by acclamation by the American Osteopathic Association, which is the largest osteopathic physician member organization.

### **Membership**

The OIA has 79 organisational members representing 28 countries on 5 continents; 10 Full, 9 Associate and 60 Partner members.

### **OIA Proposed Bylaw Changes**

Also introduced at the AGM, were three proposed bylaws changes to be voted upon at the 2016 AGM. The first was a dues increase and the remaining two focused on succession planning.

#### **◆ Proposed 2017 Dues Increase**

It is in the best interest of the financial stability of the organization to maintain between six months and two years of operating funds in reserve. The OIA currently has six months of operating funds in a reserve fund, however the strategic plan directs the board to also use these funds for special projects undertaken to enhance collaboration with the WHO. It is the Board's opinion that the reserve fund needs to be increased to meet both of these conditions, the strategic plan directive and financial stability of the OIA. The proposed bylaws changes will be sent to all members 60 days prior to the 2016 AGM. Since the organization was created in 2005, there has only been one dues increase in 2010. More information will be provided in future newsletters.

#### **◆ The Importance of Succession Planning**

Succession planning is an essential part of good governance. It can be used to build strong leadership, help a business survive the daily changes in the marketplace, and force executives to review and examine the company's current goals. To ensure continuity of the OIA's strategic goals, the OIA Board agreed that the best succession planning for the organization and external relationships would be for the Vice-chair position to be changed to Chair-elect. This position would be a protected position with the intent to work together with the immediate past chair prior to becoming Chair. More details will be presented in the coming months, and this issue will be presented for ratification by Full members in 2016.


